


Figure 2. Overview of haul routes in Osage County, OK (not to scale, Source: Dynatest).




Figure 2. Overview of haul routes in Osage County, OK (not to scale, Source: Dynatest) (continued).




Figure 2. Overview of haul routes in Pawnee County, OK (not to scale, Source: Dynatest).
