#### 11. Reports from the following with discussion:

#### A. Congressional Representatives

- Mack Savala from Senator Lankford's office stated that if you are leaving the country to start early on getting your passport it is taking an extralong time to get a passport. There is about an 8-month backlog.
- Crystal Campbell from Markwayne Mullin's office stated that they are helping with the latest storm damage to coordinate removing tree debris around Northeast Oklahoma. Their office is tracking and trying to help with grain and fertilizer prices during the Ukraine war. Mrs. Campbell stated that the Senator sponsored a bill that would strike down the EV mandates that California is putting out there. He doesn't feel like the electric vehicle mandates are right for Oklahoma.
- Senator Alley Seifried introduced herself as a Senator in this area for District 2. She stated that she has been working on teacher pay raises, maternity leave for teachers, and tax credits for parents that want to send their kids to private schools.

#### B. Tribal Representative

#### C. COG Representatives

• No report was given.

#### D. ODOT – Local Government

- Melissa Davis with ODOT local government spoke on the Municipal Road District Activity Fund, MRDAF is for a population of 15,000 or less with roadways that have been damage from oilfield activity. There is \$5 million available with a 75/25 cost-share split. Mrs. Davis stated that counties can help the cities to provide match or partner with. Mrs. Davis explained that the Bridge Formula Program (BFP) paperwork for scour bridges has been turned in to the consultants and they are working on them. This may take some time due to this is a federally funded program and will need NEPA, and 404 permits. Melissa mentioned they have also selected 10 cities to replace SD bridges.
- Ryan Gulliksen with ODOT local government explained that there have been 14 lake access awarded. He stated that CIRB FY24-28 plan is on the July 10<sup>th</sup> transportation commission meeting. ODOT will start interviewing for Shelly Williams' position. He mentioned that scour mitigation will need a maintenance permit NWP4.
- Matthew Casillas mentioned that Jake Hoover, the Resident Engineer in Sand Springs, will be taking Seth Buchanan's place at ODOT as its Construction Engineer.

#### E. OCCEDB

• Randy Robinson with OCCEDB spoke on ETR stating that several outstanding loans over 5 years of age. OCCEDB needs those paid back. If not paid back within 5 years, then that county may not get another ETR.

- Randy reported on the solid waste program stating that DEQ gave \$50,000.00 for storm debris cleanup. Randy will send out a form to apply for grants to use this money.
- Randy explained on the equipment revolving fund they are having trouble getting money spent. Randy said that it's likely going to have a deadline to have money spent within 6 to 7 months.
- Rebecca Alvarez gave a report stating she had met with the grant writer for our district and the two projects that they are writing grants for are Deep Fork in Creek County and Sportsmen's Acres in Mayes County.

- David Poindexter gave a report on the ACCO meeting reporting that Randy covered a lot of what was talked about. David said that they did talk about looking at surplusing outdated equipment.
- Mike Dunlap gave a report on SIG-SIF stating there are no increases in workers comp.
- Mike reported that there will be a 40-50% increase in property liability insurance.




Figure 3-9. Flashing Yellow Arrow (FYA)

#### **Lane Departure**

A lane departure crash is defined as a crash which occurs after a vehicle crosses an edge line, center line or otherwise leaves the traveled way. Fixed object, rollover, sideswipe, and head-on crashes make up 29 percent of the serious injury and fatal crashes in the region.

#### **Intersections**

Intersecting roadways are necessary to connect people driving, walking, and cycling from one route to another. However, these intersections of roads and paths create conflict points where crashes can occur. Intersection-related crashes happen more frequently at locations where traffic volumes are high. Intersection crashes account for 44 percent of all fatal and serious injury crashes in the INCOG region.

#### **Non-Motorized Users**

Non-motorized roadway users for this plan are pedestrians and cyclists, which includes micromobility users (E-scooters, E-bikes) They are the most exposed and least protected users of the roadway. Pedestrian and bicycle crashes account for twelve percent of the fatal and serious injury crashes on roadways within the INCOG region. These crashes tend to occur less frequently than other crash types, but tend to be more severe for the non-motorized user. Recognizing and addressing the vulnerability of non-motorized users aligns with the Safe System Approach by seeking to keep impact energy on the human body at tolerable levels.

#### **Young/Older Drivers**

Young drivers are defined as drivers under the age of 20. This demographic typically has less experience on the road and may not have the judgement necessary to avoid or handle unexpected conditions.

Older drivers are defined as drivers of the age 65 and older. Driver vision and perception-reaction time can often diminish with age, which can make driving difficult and could result in safety related consequences.

Younger drivers account for twelve percent of the fatal and serious injury crashes on roadways in the region, while older drivers account for eleven percent.

#### **Behavior**

Research shows that the human element is a contributing factor in over 90 percent of crashes (FHWA, 2021). The Safe System Approach recognizes that road users will make mistakes and attempts to accommodate for those mistakes through safe roads, safe users, safe vehicles, and safe speeds. Key behaviors associated with crashes include speeding, impaired driving, unbelted occupants, and distracted driving.

Alcohol-involved crashes account for fifteen percent of the fatal and serious injury crashes on roadways in the region, and unbelted occupants comprise thirteen percent of the fatalities and serious injuries. Speed-related and distracted driving crash data were not available; however, the INCOG stakeholders recognized these behaviors as priorities for safety countermeasures.

**Emphasis Area Objective**: Reduce the number of fatalities and serious injuries involving unbelted vehicle occupants, speed, aggressive driving, impaired driving, and distracted driving

# SCOPE OF SERVICES July 18, 2023

The purpose of this project is to prepare a transportation safety plan in CED #1.

The scope of work includes assisting CED #1 with developing their Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Safety Action Plan (SAP), per the guidelines set forth by the U.S. Department of Transportation; DOT-OST-2023-0048; USDOT FY23 Safe Streets and Roads for All Funding.

The scope of work for this project includes a high-level plan briefly summarizing the criteria described in the "Developing a Transportation Plan" manual issued by the FHWA.

The scope of GUY's service under this engineering contract will include:

#### **SECTION 1 - Safety Action Plan**

- 1.1. Provide an introduction to the CED's commitment to safety through its planning process.
- 1.2. Provide a summary of the CED's vision and goals for safety improvements in their transportation system.
- 1.3. Identify and list safety partners that are committed to assisting in improving safety procedures within the CED which may include tribal police departments, County Sheriffs, schools, public health departments, transportation departments, community groups, local medical professionals, etc.


